


REMOTE AFRICA SAFARIS LTD

MWALESHI CAMP, NORTH LUANGWA NATIONAL PARK

INFORMATION SHEET



CHALETS	4 thatch chalets
OPENING DATES	15 th June – 31 st Oct
LOCATION	North Luangwa National Park, Eastern Zambia
RECOMMENDED STAY	3-5 nights
ACTIVITIES	Exclusive walking safaris, sleep-out (all camp activity)
TRANSFERS	30min flight from Mwanya airstrip OR 40min flight from Mfuwe (optional extra) AND 20min drive into camp

Mwaleshi Camp, located in the vast wilderness of North Luangwa National Park, is hidden within mopane forest on a scenic bend of the Mwaleshi River. The camp is a truly special and remarkable place, its simplistic yet comfortable nature ensures a pure wilderness experience. There are few roads in this remote area and the majority of activities are done on foot, following existing animal trails through pristine savannah.

Mwaleshi has just four thatched chalets which are rebuilt annually out of natural materials and have uninterrupted views of the spectacular Mwaleshi River and ensuite bathrooms open to the stars. Being so remote, the camp has a genuine feeling of solitude and seclusion.



Morning walks start early to avoid the heat of the day, and are led by an experienced walking guide and armed National Parks scout. Guides consider the abilities of the group to ensure the comfort of guests throughout. Drinking water is supplied readily and the accompanying tea-bearer conjures up a welcome cuppa' and light snack during a mid-way break. Guests return to camp mid-morning with time to relax and take a refreshing wallow in the Mwaleshi river before a delicious lunch. The afternoon walk is shorter with the walk returning before dusk.

The landscape is generally flat but paths can be uneven, so lightweight, comfortable walking shoes are recommended. Longer stays may consider a day trip to the Mwaleshi falls or a sleep out in the bush for the brave (whole camp activities).

Birders can enjoy up to 416 species including the Chestnut-mantled Sparrow Weaver, the Yellow-throated Longclaw and the White-winged Starling.

General wildlife is prolific and it's also the only place one is likely to glimpse a wild black rhino in Zambia. Following their extinction during the 1980s, rhino were successfully re-introduced here in 2003. Mwaleshi Camp is situated within the rhino sanctuary, improving chances of spotting this iconic species. Expect to see elephant, puku, impala and several Cookson's wildebeest grazing along the Mwaleshi verges, as well as spotted hyenas wallowing in the shallows. Here, hyenas are known for their pack-hunting prowess rather than the scavenging behaviour typical in other areas. There are several growing wild dog packs and healthy prides of lion to be found and tracking these cats on foot add an extra thrill to the walking safari.
