NKASA LINYANTI: FACTS & INFORMATION

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NKASA LINYANTI IS A TRUE WILDERNESS ESCAPE, SET ON AN EXCLUSIVE CONCESSION, IN AN UNDISCOVERED CORNER OF NAMIBIA.

WHERE IS NKASA LINYANTI

18°27'51.80"S 23°38'3.00"E

The camp is in the Nkasa Rupara National Park on Nkasa Island, located in the most southern part of the park, with the southern boundary being the Linyanti and Kwando Rivers. Nkasa Island is a large expanse of high ground that has direct access to the Linyanti main channel.

Sandwiched between the Linyanti and Kwando rivers, and butting onto Botswana to the south, Nkasa Rupara National Park is surrounded on two of its three sides by Botswana. It is located to the west of Chobe National Park and immediately to the north of Botswana's famous and well-respected safari lodges in the Linyanti and Kwando region, with the famed Okavango Delta just a further 75km further south.

WHEN IS A GOOD TIME TO GO

Nkasa Linyanti is open year-round with excellent game viewing throughout the seasons. Water levels are highest in April to October for exploring on mokoros and boats. At other times of year, water activities may be restricted.

Dry season: April – October

Green season: November – March

HOW DO I GET THERE

Access by Air: There is air connectivity from Windhoek or Maun to Katima Mulilo with FlyNamibia. Seat Rates are available on Wednesdays, Fridays and Sundays; charters are possible daily.

Utilising the new Fly-In Zambezi service, guests then connect to camp via a light aircraft charter flight from Katimo Mulilo to Lianshulu airstrip, where they will be collected by our vehicle for the road transfer and game drive to camp.

Access by Road: Transfers by road are available from Katima Mulilo, Kasane and Victoria Falls. Guests are transferred in comfortable vehicles to Sangwali where they will be met by our guide and vehicle for the road transfer to Nkasa Rupara National Park and onward game drive into camp. Access is possible on a self-drive basis as far as the park entrance, where guests will leave their vehicles (at the Ranger station) and transfer in game drive vehicles to camp. Vehicles must be 4x4 (especially in the rainy season) or have high clearance.

Road transfer times:

Katimo Mulilo to Sangwali – 1.5 hours

Lianshulu Airstrip to Sangwali – 35 minutes

Kasane to Sangwali – 4 hours

Victoria Falls to Sangwali – 5 to 6 hours

Sangwali to Nkasa Linyanti – approximately 2 hours

Sangwali to the park entrance – 45 minutes

Park entrance to Nkasa Linyanti – approximately 1 hour

WHERE WILL I STAY

Set beneath mature leadwood and sausage trees, and raised above the floodplains, 6 standard twin/double tented rooms will have ensuite bathrooms with indoor and outdoor showers. The interior décor will convey a sense of understated charm through the use of organic textures in natural tones.

WHAT WILL I EAT

Our wonderful chefs have a reputation for good, wholesome meals. Please let us know of any dietary requirements prior to arrival.

WHAT ARE THE FACILITIES

The open-plan main area includes a bar, shaded outdoor terrace and fire pit. Walkways on the ground lead to a private swimming pool and the comfortable rooms.

INCLUDED/EXCLUDED IN THE RATE

Airstrip transfers, all meals, daily activities, local drinks and laundry are included. Flights, premium brand beverages, discretionary tips/gratuities, items of a personal nature and personal travel insurance are excluded.

WHAT DO I NEED TO KNOW

- Solar power will provide 24-hour electricity in the tents plus charging facilities.
- Wi-Fi is available in rooms only.
- We welcome children 6 years and older.



WHAT WILL I DO HERE?

Year Round:

- Morning and afternoon game drives in the concession area and national park.
- Night drives in the concession area.
- Guided Walks (seasonal)
- Boating on the Linyanti River and mokoro safaris in the back channels and floodplains of the concession area, subject to water levels.
- Incredible bird watching.
- Cultural excursions to nearby communities.

*Children aged 6 years & older may take part in a mokoro excursion or boat safari.
Children under 12 must wear a life jacket on a mokoro.
Children aged 16 years and over may take part in a walking safari.*
